Note: The valuation figure for beef cattle is not the value of, but the profit derived from 9,000 head. The average farm price or base price is the net returns received by the grower for fruit or other commodity delivered at the packing house, cannery or home market. This is not the selling price of the commodity but is the net price to the grower after costs of packing, processing, loading, selling, etc. have been deducted. With such products as wool and hops it is the delivered price at warehouse or car.
